

4B HANDBOOK



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Welcome to 4B! I am excited to be on your team this year. Our best work can be done when we understand the rules, expectations, and routines. This handbook is for you! Please read it and share it with your parents.

Class Rules

In 4B we are always: Respectful, Responsible, Helpful, and Safe. We will discuss these rules and come up with examples of each. It is your responsibility to follow these rules.

Thank You Notes

These are bestowed upon any student in thanks for appropriate behavior. The tickets can be used to buy items at our super duper class auction.

Consequences

Our class rules are your responsibility. If the rules are not followed, then consequences occur.

Consequences for **NOT** following the rules:

- 1) Warning
- 2) Lose 5 minutes of recess
- 3) Lose entire recess
- 4) Conduct referral to Parents and Vice Principal
- 5) Removal from class

Consequences for **FOLLOWING** the rules:

- 1) Verbal praise
- 2) Popcorn Party
- 3) Treats

- 4) Note or phone call home
- 5) Certificate
- 6) Free Time
- 7) Special job

If disruptive behavior becomes a habit, we will need to set up a program for change. You, your parents and I will write a contract for new behavior. We will set up daily communication to monitor your progress.

School rules

Some rules are for the whole school, like fighting, defacing the school building, abusive language or physical endangerment. If these rules are broken, you will visit Ms. Sperry, our Vice-Principal for Students. She will go through these four steps:

- 1) Have student name the problem
- 2) Have the student name the effect of their behavior
- 3) Have the student list alternatives to behavior
- 4) Take appropriate action/give consequences

Ms. Sperry will write up the incident, file it on her computer, send home a note and contact your parents.

Morning responsibilities

At 8:15 all students come into the classroom, put away belongings, turn homework into the homework shelf and begin your work for the day. It is important to remember that once you are in the classroom your work day has started.

Uniform Check

Each morning during our opening, we will check to see if our uniforms are correct and appropriate. If you are unsure of the uniform requirements, check in the St. Joseph Handbook.

On the first Tuesday of each month you will have free dress, YES!

Student of the Week

Each week one student will be chosen to be our student of the week. You may bring in pictures or something to share with the class (music, photos, favorite treat, etc..) if you wish or just kick back and enjoy. At the end of your week you will receive a poster with messages from the entire class.

Bathroom Breaks

The class has an opportunity to use the bathrooms before morning recess (at 10:00), on the way to lunch (at 12:00), and on the way to lunch recess (12:15). If emergencies arise, please ask permission to use the bathroom by raising **two** hands and use a hall pass.

Health

It is very important that you work hard this year to keep your classmates and yourself healthy this year. You will be washing you hands and/or using Purell at different times during the day as well as wiping down your desk with sanitizing wipes prior to lunchtime.

Snack

You can eat a snack at 10:15. Please choose one healthy item from your lunch, like a piece of fruit or a granola bar. You will be able to get a drink of water, so save your drink for lunch.

Lunch

The rules in the lunchroom are written on a poster in the lunchroom. Adults in the lunchroom are in charge. Give them the respect and courtesy due to all your teachers. First Tuesday of the month:

Written Work

All written work needs to be headed as follows: Your class number will be written in the upper right hand corner. Write your first and last name in cursive, within the first line on the upper left side. On the second line write the complete date. The subject and page number should be on the third line.

Example:

Social Studies p. 15-17

All written work should be done in complete sentences. A complete sentence begins with a capital, has a subject, a predicate, and ends with appropriate punctuation.

You are responsible for finishing all assigned work. If you are unable to complete any work during class, you will need to take it home to complete.

Homework

At the end of each day the homework assignment is written in your PLANNER (provided by St. Joseph) from the board. Homework must be written in this notebook, so bring it to school EVERYDAY! This is so your parents will know what to look for to check each evening. Homework is assigned Monday-Thursday evenings and due the following morning. Turn in your homework into the appropriate tray as soon as possible. All homework will be checked in by someone on the homework crew. If you did not complete your homework you will need to stay in for recess to complete the assignment. This includes assignments that were eaten by the dog, taken by aliens, left in the car pool, colored on by little sister, etc.

You will be assigned many long-term projects throughout the year. You will have plenty of time to complete these projects if you manage your time well.

If for some reason you do not have your planner when you get home from school and you need the assignment, go to our class web page stjoseph4th.weebly.com and you will find the days assignments.

Thursday Packet

Work for the week will come home in a folder on Thursday afternoon. Please take a few minutes each week to go over your work with your parents. This is the best way for you to keep your parents informed!

Book Orders

I will send home book order forms to 3-4 book clubs. The orders and individual checks are due back the following Wednesday. Please do not feel obligated to order these books. I send them home because they provide an inexpensive way for you to buy books, the selection is excellent and we get free books for our classroom with the money you spend. Book orders should be delivered in a marked envelope.

Scored Work

Selected work will be scored. I will not score work with new concepts until you have had time to feel comfortable about the new material. I will tell you about the test ahead of time, so that you can be ready for them! If you do poorly in a test, it can be retaken within one week, and the two test grades will be averaged to improve your grade. (Spelling tests may not be retaken)

Report Cards

Three times a year, at the trimester, a report card go home. The card should be reviewed by your parents and returned to the classroom. Report cards must be returned and the envelope signed.

At the mid-point in each trimester a report will go home to show progress. These do not need to be returned, but the envelope must be signed and returned.

Conferences

I will meet with you and your parents in the fall and in the spring for a conference on your progress. Additionally, I will be happy to meet with your parents at any time during the year, if there is a need for a conference.

Absent/Tardy

A note should be sent to me from your parents if you are absent or tardy (after 8:25). Please have your parents check their handbook for these policies.

Birthdays

Birthdays may be celebrated by wearing free dress and by bringing a treat to share with the class. I request that you do not bring a cake because it is messy and time consuming. Cupcakes are ok if you bring napkins. It is not necessary to send something to drink, but if you do, please send cups. Keep it simple. Cookies or other “neat” treats are preferable. Some 4th grade students choose not to bring a treat, that’s ok too!
